Ed Code (44662) "Stull Act"

ARTICLE 11. Evaluation and Assessment of Performance of Certificated Employees

The governing board of each school district shall evaluate and assess certificated employee performance as it reasonably relates to: (1) The progress of pupils toward the standards established pursuant to subdivision (a) and, if applicable, the state adopted academic content standards as measured by state adopted criterion referenced assessments.

Student Assessment Board Policy (6162.5) Approved

Excerpt from BP 6162.5 reads: "The Governing Board recognizes that student assessments are an important instructional and accountability tool. To obtain the most accurate evaluation of student performance, the district shall use a variety of measures, including district, state, and/or national assessments. (cf. 6162.51 - State Academic Achievement Tests) Assessment data shall be used to help determine individual students' progress, mastery of academic standards, appropriate placement in district programs, and/or eligibility for graduation. In addition, summary data on student assessment results shall be used by the district to identify and review student achievement goals in the district's local control and accountability plan, evaluate district educational programs in order to identify needed improvements, and, as appropriate, evaluate staff performance."

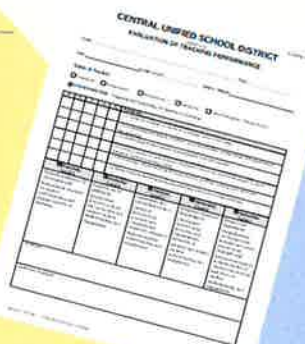
"staff" refers to Superintendent, Administrators, and Teachers (cf. 2140 - Evaluation of the Superintendent), (cf. 4115 - Evaluation/Supervision - Certificated Staff), (cf. 4315 - Evaluation/Supervision - Administrators)

"as appropriate" is defined by looking at the California Standards for the Teaching Profession (CSTPs)
