

*Dress code input from parents, students, and staff—spring 2017*

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- Girls should be allowed to wear leggings without a skirt over them. (1 response)
- Allow leggings as they are sold as pants: as long as they are not see through (1 response)
- Allow girls to wear leggings (not tights) with a shirt long enough to cover their bottom. (4 responses)
