Central High School had an enrollment of 4,176 for the 2017/18 school year. The school has two sites, the West Campus and the East Campus but operates as a single high school in terms of its programs, sports and academics. Construction is scheduled to start on a new high school on property owned by Central Unified adjacent to the existing stadium on the corner of N. Grantland Ave and W. Ashlan Ave. Construction is scheduled to start in 2019-20 school year once the Office of Public School Construction releases our state matching share of building funds.
