PHILOSOPHY, GOALS, OBJECTIVES AND COMPREHENSIVE PLANS

School Plans/School Site Councils

The Governing Board believes that comprehensive planning that is aligned with the district's local control and accountability plan (LCAP) is necessary at each school, in order to focus school improvement efforts on student academic achievement and facilitate the effective use of available resources. The Superintendent or designee shall ensure that school plans provide clear direction and identify cohesive strategies aligned with school and district goals.

Each district school <u>that participates in one or more federal and/or state categorical programs</u> funded through the state's consolidated application process pursuant to Education Code 64000 shall establish a school site council in accordance with Education Code 52852 and the accompanying administrative regulation to develop, review, and approve school plans.

For any school that participates in specified state and/or federal categorical programs, the <u>65000-65001</u>. The school site council or other schoolwide advisory committee shall consolidatedevelop, approve, and annually review and update a school plan for student achievement (SPSA) which consolidates the plans required for those categorical programs into a single plan for student achievement (SPSA)., unless otherwise prohibited by law. (Education Code 64001)

As appropriate, a school may incorporate any other school program into the SPSA. (Education Code 64001) The Superintendent or designee shall review each school's SPSA to ensure that it meets the content requirements for all <u>applicable</u> programs <u>included</u>, is based on an analysis of current practices and student academic performance, and reasonably links improvement strategies to identified needs of the school and its students. <u>He/sheThe Superintendent or</u> <u>designee</u> shall also ensure that <u>consistency between the</u> specific actions included in the district's <u>LCAP are consistent withlocal control and accountability plan and</u> the strategies identified in each school's SPSA.

The Board shall, at a regularly scheduled Board meeting, review and approve each school's SPSA. Any subsequent whenever there are any material revisions affecting the academic

programs for students participating in the categorical programs addressed in the SPSA-shall beapproved by the School Site Council. The Board shall certify that, to the extent allowable under federal law, the SPSA is consistent with district local improvement plans required as a conditionof receiving federal funding. (Education Code 64001)

Whenever<u>If</u> the Board does not approve a school's SPSA, it shall communicate its specific reasons for disapproval of the plan to the school site council or committee. The school site council or committee shall then revise and resubmit the SPSA to the Board for its approval. (Education Code <u>5285564001</u>)

The Superintendent or designee shall ensure that school administrators and school site council members receive training on the roles and responsibilities of the <u>school</u> site council.

The SPSA may serve as the school improvement plan required when a school is identified for targeted or comprehensive support pursuant to 20 USC 6303. (Education Code 64001)

Any complaint alleging noncompliance with requirements related to the establishment of school site councils or the development of the SPSA may be filed with the district in accordance with the district's uniform complaint procedures pursuant to 5 CCR 4600-4670 and BP/AR 1312.3 - Uniform Complaint Procedures.
